If you're new to miniatures, this guide will help you understand the tools, supplies, and basic skills you'll need, along with tips for choosing the right dollhouse and deciding whether to start with a kit or build from scratch.

TOOLS YOU'LL NEED

BASIC TOOLS

- Craft knife or hobby knife
- Cutting mat
- Metal ruler
- Sandpaper (fine grit)
- Tweezers
- Small clamps or clothespins
- Mini hammer
- Small screwdrivers
- Paint brushes
- Pencil and measuring tape

HELPFUL POWER TOOLS (OPTIONAL)

- Rotary tool (such as a Dremel)
- Mini drill
- Tabletop sander



HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT DOLLHOUSE

- 1 Choose the Right Scale**
The most common scale is 1:12 (one inch equals one foot). It offers the largest selection of miniatures and building supplies.
- 2 Consider Your Skill Level**
Start with a smaller house, fewer rooms, and simpler details.
- 3 Think About Space**
Make sure you have enough workspace during construction and a permanent display location afterward.
- 4 Decide on Your Style**
Choose a house style that excites you: cottage, farmhouse, Victorian, colonial, modern, beach house and more!



ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES

COMMON MATERIALS

- Wood glue
- Tacky glue
- Acrylic paint
- Primer
- Wood filler
- Basswood or plywood
- Wallpaper or scrapbook paper
- Fabric scraps
- Trim and molding pieces

MINIATURE SUPPLIES

- Flooring materials
- Dollhouse windows and doors
- Furniture kits
- LED lighting kits
- Tiny hardware and accessories



BASIC SKILLS THAT HELP



MEASURING & CUTTING

Accurate measurements are important in miniatures because even tiny mistakes become noticeable in small scales.



SANDING & PAINTING

Smooth edges and clean paint finishes make a huge difference in the final appearance.



PATIENCE & ATTENTION TO DETAIL

Miniatures require precision and careful handling of small pieces.



FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS

Most kits include detailed assembly instructions, so being able to follow step-by-step directions is valuable.

The good news is that these skills improve quickly with practice! ♥

DOLLHOUSE KITS vs. BUILDING FROM SCRATCH

One of the biggest decisions beginners face is whether to buy a kit or build completely from scratch. Both options have advantages and challenges.

USING A DOLLHOUSE KIT



PROS

- ♥ Beginner friendly
- ♥ Faster construction
- ♥ Lower skill requirement
- ♥ Predictable results

CONS

- ✗ Limited customization
- ✗ Pre-cut errors may require adjustments
- ✗ Less creative freedom



BUILDING FROM SCRATCH

PROS

- ♥ Complete creative freedom
- ♥ Unique results
- ♥ Skill development
- ♥ Easier customization

CONS

- ✗ More time consuming
- ✗ Higher skill level
- ✗ More tools required
- ✗ Greater chance of mistakes

TIPS FOR FIRST-TIME BUILDERS



START SMALL
A smaller project helps you build confidence.



DON'T RUSH
Miniatures are all about details. Take your time and enjoy the process.



PRACTICE BEFORE FINAL ASSEMBLY
Test paint colors, wallpaper, and flooring before gluing everything permanently.



EXPECT IMPERFECTIONS
Every builder makes mistakes. Tiny flaws are part of handmade charm.



JOIN THE MINIATURE COMMUNITY
Online groups, tutorials, and forums are wonderful places to learn and find inspiration.
